MICROCHIP



MAKE SURE DETAILS ARE KEPT UP TO DATE

Of dogs are stolen from gardens.



MAKE SURE YOUR GARDEN IS SECURE AND NO-ONE CAN ENTER WITHOUT YOUR KNOWLEDGE. DON'T LEAVE YOUR DOG UNATTENDED IN THE GARDEN.

• Vary the times you walk and the routes you take. practice good recall.
• Always keep your dog in sight!

An easy target, never leave your dog in the car. Even for just a few minutes!

WHAT TO DO IF YOUR DOG IS STOLEN?

- Call 999 if you've seen your dog being taken.
- Call 101 if you suspect your dog has been stolen or report suspicious activity.
- Call your dog's microchip database.
- Call the local animal warden.
- Call local veterinary clinics and rescues.
- Get on social media.

Be extra vigilant if you have a pregnant bitch or a litter of puppies. Be especially careful if you have advertised a litter for sale. **Secure your property!**

KEEP

your dog's microchip number and the database contact number in your phone.

wear headphones when walking your dog.
